




This GALEX image of the Andromeda galaxy (M31) shows blue regions of young, hot, high mass stars tracing out the spiral arms where star formation is occurring, and the central yellow-white "bulge" of old, cooler stars formed long ago. M110 and M32, two companion galaxies of M31, are also visible in the image.
